The new **boundary fence** is underway and construction has started in the native area. The front of the school will be completed over the holiday break. When we return from holiday the entry to the school will look quite different. The gates will be 1.6m high and the fence 1.8m. The gates will be closed just after 9am and reopened just before 3pm. This is to ensure our students are kept safe and have no access to the car park during

the day. Students will be able to come into school through the office when the gates are closed. When coming to the office from classes or the playground during the day

students will enter through the door outside my office. Parents or vehicles will not be able to come into the carpark inside the bollards (area that is currently chained off) until after 2:45pm. We will

be in touch to let you know how the new gates will be managed as the term begins.

Each whānau has had two **Seesaw Posts** this term to celebrate their child's learning and progress in Te Reo and Writing, along with their Learning Map. Please take time to look at these and pop in and see your child's teacher if you have any questions.

We are fortunate to have Lisa Preston coordinating the teams for us and providing so many fabulous sporting opportunities for our tamariki.
