Next week we start our **Keeping Ourselves** Safe unit with Constable Ben Broughton from the NZ Police. This unit is taught every three years at Mosston as we believe it is vitally important for every student to know about their bodies and that they belong to them. It is also important that they recognise inappropriate behaviour by others and know who they can talk to or Dame Whina Cooper where they can go for help.
