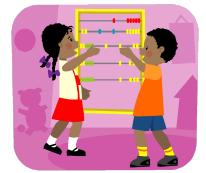









Out and about in the classes

This has allowed students to engage in real life experiences, such as writing Curriculum Vitae and application letters, the interviewing process, managing finances (including depositing and withdrawing tāra), and working in a business team to design and create a prototype. Fortunately, we were able to have our trade expo where we received feedback from students and whānau. In maths we have been focusing on geometry and learning about 2D and 3D shapes. We began our training for cross country and started our gymnastics programme. This was unfortunately cut short when we were put in Level 4 lockdown and online learning began. It was a very successful three and a half weeks of remote learning, and we thank all of you for your effort and support with this!</p>
